

Montana Manufacturing Industry 2009


- Very rough year for many
- Employment declined at half of firms, no change at 40% of firms
- Most firms reported decreased sales, profits, and production
- Few firms had worker shortages
- Almost 40% of firms did make major capital expenditures

Total firms: 3,000






Yellowstone County Manufacturing Estimated 2009 Labor Income Distribution



Gallatin County Manufacturing Estimated 2009 Labor Income Distribution




Butte-Silver Bow County Manufacturing Estimated 2009 Labor Income Distribution






Cascade County Manufacturing Estimated 2009 Labor Income Distribution





Montana Forest Products Industry 2009 Recap

- 4th straight year of declines
- Several large mills permanently shut down
- Employment down 20% (about 1,700 workers)
- Timber harvest volume down 40%
- Product sales value down 23%
- Lumber production down 38%


Montana Forest Products Forecast

- 2010 markets expected to be better than 2009
- Timber harvest & lumber production volumes expected to remain low with loss of mills
- Employment expected to be lower
- Forests will become more expensive to manage
- Not out of the woods yet!


Montana Manufacturing Forecast for 2010

- Recovery slowed by major shut-downs
- Manufacturers are more optimistic


Montana Manufacturing Outlook for the Coming Year




Manufacturing Employment Outlook for the Coming Year




Missoula County Manufacturing Outlook for 2010




Flathead County Manufacturing Outlook for 2010








