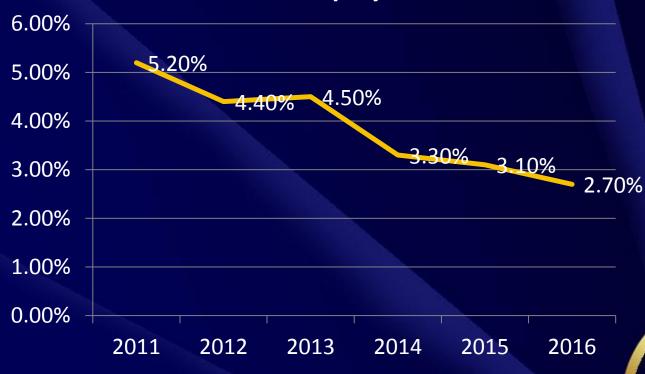

Employment in Helena Area...

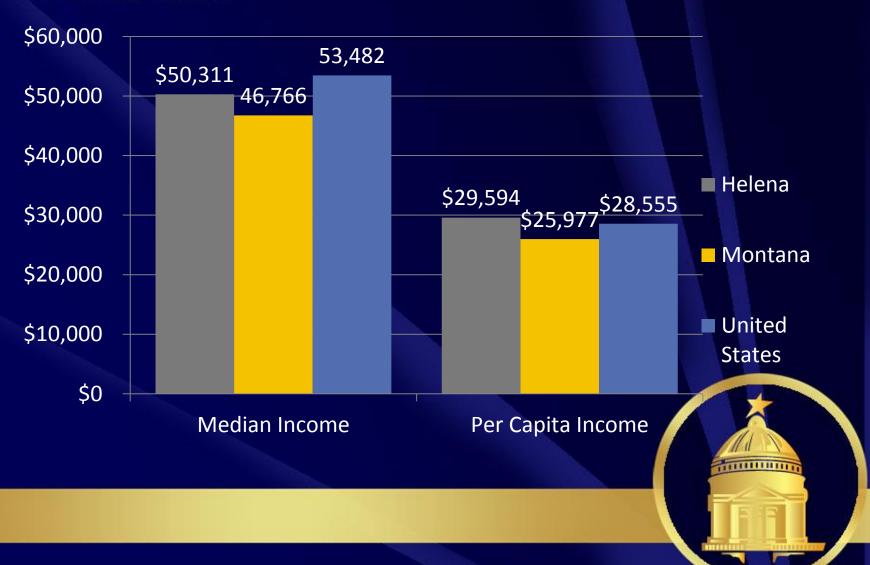
Helena Unemployment Rate





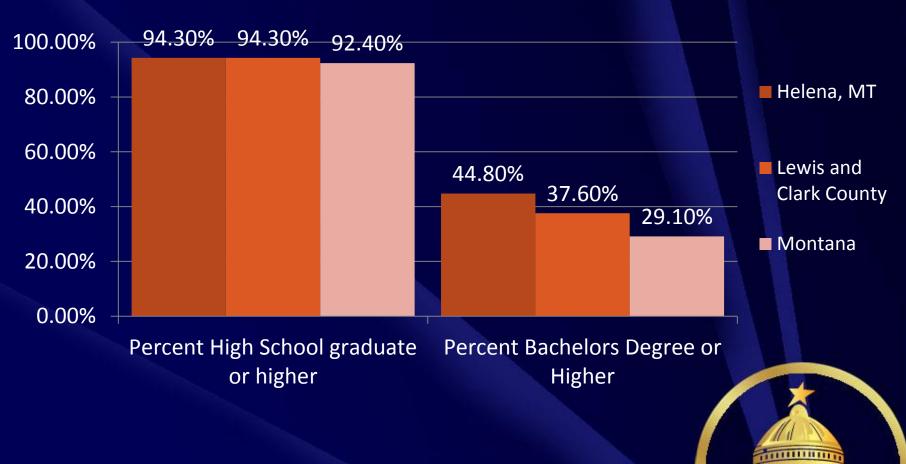


Income Comparisons

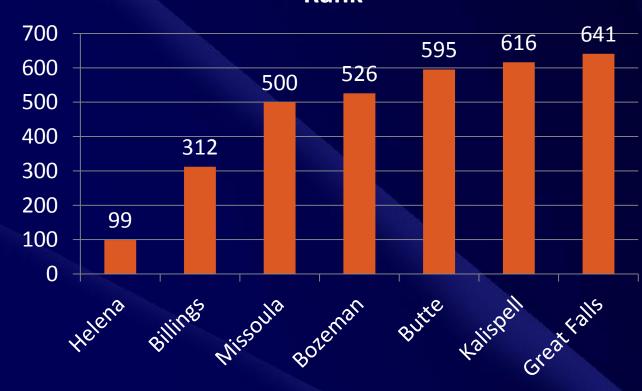

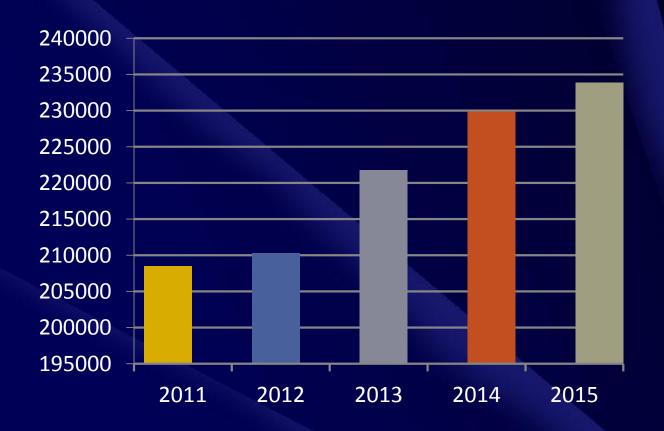
