

SouthWest MT – Population




Growth in SouthWest MT has accelerated since 2015.

 2020-2021 growth of 1.4% or 1,171 people was strongest growth on record







- MT's population is the 5th oldest of the 50 states (behind Maine, Florida, West Virginia, and New Hampshire.

- SW MT's population 65 and older was 22.7% (all counties with exception of Silver Bow above statewide average)




SouthWest Montana – Labor Force








Unemployment Rates – Nov 2022



Income and Wages






- The Average Weekly Wage in SW MT was \$950 as of Q2 2022. This was 7% less than the overall statewide average of \$1,028.
- MT's average weekly ranked 44th of the 50 states.
- Silver Bow County ranks 18th among MT's 56 counties in terms of wages.

- Over 52 weeks, the annual average wage in SW MT was \$49,215.
- MT's average annual wage was \$53,546.
- Between 2021 and 2022, growth in wages in SW MT was 8.1%, exceeding the overall statewide average increase.
- Government Stimulus payments and inflationary increases drove 2021-22 growth.






- The towns in SW MT have a lower cost of living than the overall statewide and U.S. average driven in part by favorable home costs and housing.
- The cost of living in Silver Bow County is approximately 20% below the overall national average.
- In contrast, the cost of living in Bozeman is over 25% higher than the national average driven by home costs and housing.




Silver Bow County – Labor Force

- U.S. macroeconomic conditions will slow growth in 2023. Rising interest rates, continuing supply chain issues, and inflationary pressures impacting our areas.
- Housing and banking/mortgage markets down 50% over prior year.
- Tight labor market continues to provide challenges for businesses and production.

Outlook: Continued Growth and Expansion

- Our areas are poised for continued growth:
 - Attractive cost of living, strong base of major employers, additions from Dvele Modular Homes, 1923 Series impacts, Praxis Center development, and other
 - 2023 nationally and locally will see slowing in spending and construction due to higher interest rates, and unemployment rates should rise from all-time lows.
 - Partial offset Social Security increase in 2023 at 8.7% older population base
