
- Inventory Correction Fuels U.S. Growth Spurt

   Growth


- Europe's Weakest




#### The Outlook for U.S. Growth

- Concern over Europe, unemployment, and sluggish consumer spending have downgraded forecasts


## Large Businesses Leading Growth, Small Businesses Still MIA






# Half of Those Unemployed are Long-Term Jobless






#### **Government Borrowing is Exploding**




#### **But Private Borrowing is in Reverse**





#### Flathead and Gallatin County Construction Economies Fall to Earth






**Construction Employment Index, 2001 Q1 = 100.**




## Actual and Projected Change in Nonfarm Labor Income, Montana, 2007-2013





# Montana Payroll Employment Growth by Sector


