- Navigation menu collapses for easier visibility.
- Attendees can see and search for all other attendees, speakers and sponsors via filters. Filters refine the participant search based on city, company and other affiliations.
- Conference badges can be clicked to launch a pop-up with more information and the opportunity to text chat.





Economic Outlook Seminar – online platform social lounge:

Participants may enter any Social Lounge by clicking "Join Room" and network via the embedded zoom video meeting platform. Attendees can see if a room is full before entering, or plan to meet each other in specific social lounges at a set time.





Economic Outlook Seminar – online platform social lounge:

Once inside the Social Lounge, participants interact via the embedded Zoom meeting platform, where they can privately chat with others in the room. They can view other lounges in the left navigation and jump from one lounge to another, interacting with multiple attendees, or plan to "meet" in a specific lounge at a set time.
