



- The 2018 increase in SW MT was faster • than overall statewide average increase for first time in many years.




Census Estimated % Change in Population







SouthWest Montana – Labor Force










Between 2018 and 2019 employment grew 1.4% or 533 workers in SW MT. Unemployment levels continue to fall. Tight Labor Market!

Average Weekly Wage

- The Average Weekly Wage in SW MT was approximately \$780 as of Q2 2019. This was 7% less than the overall statewide average of \$843.
- MT's average weekly wage was 15% below the U.S. average of \$1,095.
- Silver Bow County ranks 22nd among MT's 56 counties in terms of wages.






- The towns in SW MT have a lower cost of living than the overall statewide and U.S. average driven in part by favorable home costs and housing.
- The cost of living in Silver Bow County is approximately 20% below the overall national average.
- In contrast, the cost of living in Bozeman is over 20% higher than the national average driven by home costs and housing.




Silver Bow County – Labor Force

- Recent positive impacts and job growth from the addition of First Call Resolution (+200), continued additions and expansion at MT Connections driven by Precision Products manufacturing, Old Dominion, Western States Asphalt, and others. This area now has over 600 workers with expansion continuing.
- Growth in construction, manufacturing, professional services, transportation, self employed, and food services offset reductions in government, retail trade, and mining.
- Stability and continued investment from our major employers.
